He was a well-known king who ruled our state of Tripura from the year 1923 to 1947. He was popularly known as the modern architect. He was born on August 19, 1908 in Tripura. He was the son of Maharaja Birendra Kishor Manikya Bahadur Debbarmen. He was a patron of arts and culture. He

supported various cultural activities and institutions fostering a rich cultural heritage. Maharaja Bir Bikram maintained good relations with the Bengali Hindu community in his kingdom, who held important ministerial and administrative positions in his kingdom. He was the first ruler who visited Europe and America in 1939. He was considered one of the pioneers of the land reforms. He died at a very young age of 39 in 1947.

Sep 13th : Holy Cross Feast & Principal's Day:



Our Annual Feast:



